

Results of British Columbia Emergency Health Services (BCEHS) Global Rating Question

Using any number from 0 to 10, where 0 is the worst care possible and 10 is the best care possible, what number would you use to rate your care from paramedics when you were taken to the emergency department?

BCEHS1. Reported paramedics treated them with courtesy and respect (ALWAYS)	92.1%	89.5%	95.1%*	92.3%	96.4%	91.9%	93.7%
BCEHS2. Reported paramedics listened carefully to them (ALWAYS)	89.2%	86.3%	92.4%	89.8%	85.7%	87.0%	93.3%*
BCEHS3. Reported paramedics explained things in a way they could understand (ALWAYS)	84.2%	83.1%	84.7%	81.5%	89.3%	82.7%	87.8%
BCEHS4. Reported being comfortable talking with paramedics about their worries or concerns (ALWAYS)	83.4%	81.3%	83.5%	86.1%	85.7%	81.4%	87.7%
BCEHSS. Reported having confidence and trust in the paramedics treating them (ALWAYS)	88.4%	87.3%	90.5%	92.3%	82.1%	84.9%	90.2%
BCEHS6. Rated their care from paramedics with a 9 or 10 on a scale from 0 (worst care possible) to 10 (best care possible)	82.8%	79.3%	88.5%*	86.6%	85.7%	76.6%*	87.4%*

Note: * denotes a statistically significant difference (p <0.05)

[†] Patients who reported they were transported to the Emergeny Department by ambulance were asked to provide their assessment of the quality of their care from paramedics during the transport. Of the 14,076 patients who completed the 2018 BC Emergency Department survey, 1,842 (or 13.1%) reported being transported to the ED by ambulance.
