BCEHS taking action to create safe, respectful and inclusive workplaces

VANCOUVER – BC Emergency Health Services (BCEHS) continues taking action to ensure its workplaces are respectful, inclusive, and foster the mental and well-being of employees.

Today, BCEHS shared staff survey results and an external review that provided information about the culture of BCEHS' workplace and recommendations for improvement. While some redactions were necessary to protect privacy, this material will be publicly available. That review, and the work undertaken since, strengthens the organization's culture of diversity, equity and inclusivity to better support employees.

Examples of actions underway throughout BCEHS to provide an inclusive and respectful environment, free from harassment and discrimination, are:

- improving hiring practices to ensure they are inclusive, and that recruitment includes diverse hiring panels.
- training HR teams with best practices in handling sensitive workplace investigations.
- implementing a training program for managers and supervisors to confront inappropriate behaviours effectively.
- the establishment of a confidential phone line for employees to report incidents of harassment, bullying or discrimination.
- hiring a Chief of People, Equity and Diversity to focus on dedicated action, programs, and support for employee health and well-being, culture and engagement, leadership development, and diversity, equity, and inclusion.
- strengthening employee recognition and appreciation efforts and focusing senior leadership efforts on regularly meeting with staff across the province in person to both thank them and listen to their concerns and ideas for improvement.

To ensure staff continue to be involved in these efforts, BCEHS is committed to providing ongoing updates throughout the organization.
